

BVRC General Rules and Conditions of Entry

1. All classes will be run in accordance with Official Rules for British Riding Clubs' Competitions 2011.
2. It shall be deemed a condition of entry that neither the organisers nor landowners nor their agents shall be held responsible for any loss, injury, damage to competitors, onlookers, their property, servants or horses or ponies, howsoever caused.
3. Horses may be ridden once only. Riders may enter a maximum of two horses per class.
4. Everyone mounted, whether or not a competitor, shall wear correct riding clothes which must include 'Protective Headwear', with a harness properly adjusted and fastened. Failure to do so will incur elimination. 'Protective Headwear' constitutes a hat meeting one of the following standards:

Australian & New Zealand	All SAI AS/NZS 3838	

Standards PAS015 and ASTM F1163 are considered to offer greater protection than EN1384 or BSEN1384. Skullcaps must be worn with a silk, which may be coloured for cross country. Hair must be secured in a hair net or in such a way that it does not hang lower than the shoulder line. Jewellery or any items worn in facial or body piercing are not permitted. Chaps or half-chaps may not be worn. Black or brown polished leather gaiters, with matching boots, are permitted.

Dressage Gloves are compulsory.

Show Jumping Body protectors are strongly recommended.

Cross Country A Body Protector to BETA Level 3 (Purple Label) is compulsory. An Airbag style protector, if used, must be worn over a permitted body protector. Riders wearing Exo Body Cage protectors must inform the organiser before commencing the cross country. Medical Armbands are compulsory **and MUST BE WORN ON THE RIDER'S ARM.** No receiving, recording, transmitting or monitoring devices may be used during any phase of the event.
5. The organisers reserve the right in the light of prevailing circumstances to cancel the event, alter classes, judges, times or any other published information.
6. In all cases the Judge's decision is final. Any objection shall be accompanied by a deposit of £20 and within half an hour of the incident. The deposit will be returned only if the objection is upheld.
7. There will be no refund of entry fees.
8. For the avoidance of doubt claims for consequential liability, expenses or other payments shall in no circumstances be accepted.
9. A competitor may not, under penalty of elimination, compete on a horse that has practised over any of the obstacles to be used on the course for the two weeks prior to the competition.
10. **Dogs must be kept on a short lead at all times** including whilst walking the cross country course.
11. Competitors must report to the relevant steward 10 minutes before their given start time for each phase. Failure to do so may incur elimination.
12. Competitors eliminated in the Show Jumping will not be permitted to proceed to the Cross Country. In the event of elimination on the Cross Country, competitors must leave the course, immediately at a walk, & must not jump or attempt any other obstacles.
13. For the avoidance of doubt and unless explicitly stated to the contrary, medical facilities on the showground will be limited to standard NHS accident & emergency callout.
14. Any veterinary services utilised (including horse transportation, accommodation or legal disposal of deceased animals) shall be charged to and paid by the competitor. The BVRC does not guarantee that there will be immediate access to a horse ambulance on the showground. Unless otherwise stated, the BVRC does not guarantee that there will be immediate access to veterinary services on the showground.
15. Any farrier services utilised shall be charged to and paid for by the competitor. Unless otherwise stated, the BVRC does not guarantee that there will be immediate access to a farrier on the showground.
16. BVRC does not guarantee that the showground is a secure site. BVRC cannot guarantee that the showground perimeter cannot be breached by runaway animals. It is the responsibility of the competitor to ensure, so far as is possible, that runaways cannot occur.
17. The BVRC's responsibility for runaway animals shall be limited to informing the local civil or military police. All costs incurred in any recovery including the cost of any damage incurred during the incident shall be charged to and paid by the competitor.

Competition Notes: For the avoidance of doubt, competitors shall understand that the rules and conditions of entry (listed below) are the sole terms under which the Bourne Valley Riding Club (BVRC) organises competitions. Competitors shall not enter BVR events unless they have read, understood and fully accepted these terms.

Qualification for horses & riders as per Official Rules for British Riding Clubs' Competitions 2011.

Preliminary entries are to be sent to BRC Office by Friday 10th June 2011.

Please include an SAE if you wish times to be posted.

Photocopies of Flu Vaccination certificate / Passports must be submitted with a copy of the entry form to **Sally Grant, Peeko, Orcheston, Salisbury, Wilts SP3 4RW Tel: 01984 620320 email: sallygrant@fsmail.net**

Please make sure the copy has every section (front, back & middle) of the certificate – including the name & address of the owner, the horse's name silhouette, markings & every single vaccinations entry.

Note: Where Passports are used as the flu' vaccination record, the horse description must be verified by a vet or authorised member of a breed society.

Flu Vaccination Certificate must be presented on the day, on collection of number bibs.
Spot checks will be done.

It is a condition of entry that any club entering a team or teams shall provide helpers.

Clubs shall supply three helpers per team who shall be available throughout the day (9.30am–5.30pm) or six helpers for half a day each (9.30am-2pm or 1-5.30pm).

The names & addresses of such helpers shall be submitted, on the enclosed form to **Sally Grant, Peeko, Orcheston, Salisbury, Wilts SP3 4RW** on or before Thursday 23rd June

Start times: Times will be available on www.bvrc.co.uk from 6pm on Wednesday 29th June or posted if an SAE is supplied.

Substitutions: Team changes by 8pm on Friday 1st July.
Individual substitutions will be accepted until _ hour before the start of the class, provided there is a valid reason.
